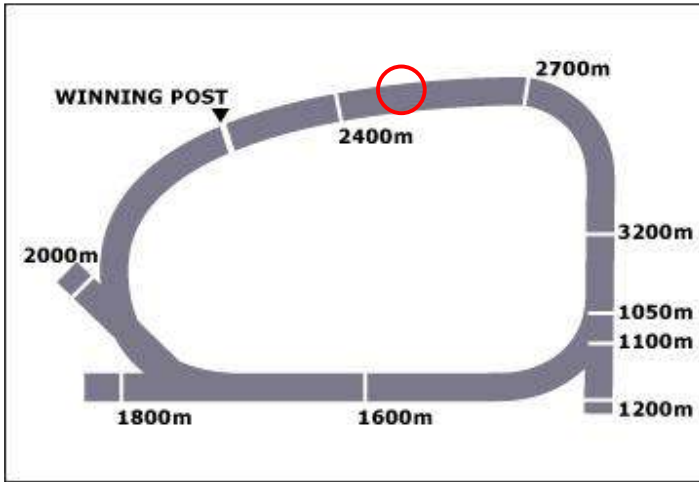

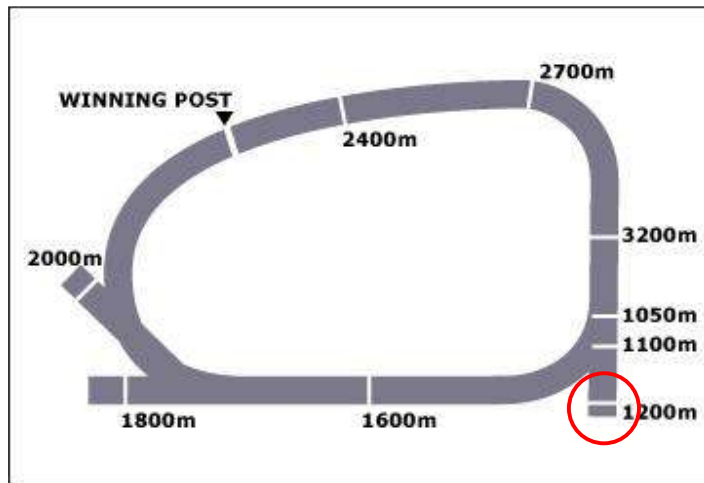
### Race Summary:

The colts in the race are a team of walkers, so the filly really picks herself. Even though the 2500m remains unproven territory, class alone with a weight pull, will be enough to win this today. **Zagreb** looks the clear pick of the colts. By Zabeel out of Danehill mare Dansino, I think the booking of D Dunn is certainly a significant pointer. Stablemate **El Daana** is a dour type who grinds her way to the line. This should suit her. **Mega Boss** looks the best of the rest. Was hitting the line last start at Caulfield and took out the Tasmanian Derby in good style prior to that. **Neugine** is the knockout of those at odds.

### Race Summary:

A much more even Group 1 and interesting looking Goodwood. A lot of the main hopes drew off the track, and that combined with the hot tempo has opened this race right up. I'm going to gamble on the 3yo filly **Vivacious Spirit** down in the weights. She is drawn to get a nice run handy and I expect that her form around the likes of Royal Asscher and Light Fantastic is strong enough. **Monet Rules** hasn't been overcooked this prep and I can see him running a race. Has drawn out deep, but brings some very respectable Group 1 Melbourne form into the race. Despite his draw, I can't get away from last year's winner, topweight **Let Go Thommo** as a legitimate danger and winning chance. He will get the speed on to suit and will be ripping home in the straight. I have some shorter in my market than him, but **Cocinero** is my best roughie, and one to throw into the multiples. I'm laying **Here De Angels**. I love this horse kept fresh, and to 1000-1100m where he can run some serious time. 1200m is less suitable and although he will be in it for a long way, I think he will be found out the last 100m.
